



Resourcing national priorities in Wales

On **10 October 2013** the Wales Association of SACREs held a national conference, focusing on national priorities impacting on Religious Education in Wales. Over 114 delegates from across Wales participated in the conference and training event at Ty Dysgu, Nantgarw, with representatives from primary and secondary schools, Local Government, and religious communities.

Mark Campion (Lead Inspector for Religious Education, Estyn) presented and discussed the main findings from the Estyn Thematic Review of Religious Education. Richard Roberts

(CfBT) introduced the implementation of and support provided for the Literacy and Numeracy Framework in Wales.

- KS3 Numeracy: statistics, graphs and questionnaires (Phil Lord)
- How can SACREs monitor standards (Bethan James)
- Literacy in the Foundation Phase: Not just a story! (Gill Vaisey)
